### Situation

Botswana is a land-locked country dominated in geographical terms by the Kalahari Desert - a sand-filled basin averaging 1,100 meters above sea level. The country lies between longitudes 20 and 30 degrees east of Greenwich and between the latitudes 18 and 27 degrees approximately south of the Equator. Botswana is surrounded by Namibia, South Africa, Zambia and Zimbabwe. Slightly larger than France and almost the size of Texas, the landmass covers 581 730 square kilometres (224 607 square miles).

### Languages

English is the official language, while Setswana is the most widely spoken African language.

### Religion

Early tribal religions were primarily cults. The supreme being and creator was known as the Modimo. Religious rites included the bogwera and bojale (male and female initiation ceremonies) and gofethla pula or rain-making rites. Today, Christianity is the prevailing belief system (well over 60% of the population). Christianity was brought to Botswana by David Livingstone in the 19th Century. The main denominations are Roman Catholic, Anglican, Zion, Lutheran and the Methodist Christian Church.

### The People

The population of Botswana is made up of people from approximately 20 different tribes, some of which came originally from Botswana's neighbouring countries: South Africa, Zimbabwe, Zambia, Angola and Namibia. Ethnic groups in Botswana are predominately made up of Tswana people (79 %) and split up among eight tribes. The others include Bamangwato, Bakwena, Bangwaketsi, Bakgatla, Barolong, Bamalete, and Batlokwa. The next largest single group of indigenous peoples is the Kalanga, which accounts for about 11% of the population and there are approximately 3% Basarwa (Bushmen). Kgalagadi and whites account for about 7%. Through the centuries, as people of the different tribes joined, they shared many of their customs.

# PRE-DEPARTURE INFORMATION



Today, all of these different customs and beliefs help make up the culture of Botswana, as well as influences from non-African places because Botswana today is a modern country. The people of Tswana origin and also the citizens of the country are called Bastwana or Motswana. The language of Botswana is Setswana, and the word is also used to describe the way of life.

## Climate

Botswana's climate is semi-arid. Though it is hot and dry for much of the year, there is a rainy season, which runs through the summer months. Rainfall tends to be erratic, unpredictable and highly regional. Often a heavy downpour may occur in one area while 10 or 15 kilometres away there is no rain at all. Rain typically falls in short thundershowers in the late afternoon. Showers are often followed by strong sunshine so that a good deal of the rainfall does not penetrate the ground but is lost to evaporation and transpiration. Rainfall is low (approximately 470 mm / 18.5 in) per year and phrases like "rainy season" should be seen in context.

## SECRETS OF TRAVEL IN THE GREEN SEASON REVEALED

Conventional wisdom states that the dry seasons are the best times to visit Africa, with the game dependent on ever-shrinking waterholes and more concentrated, so that sightings are better. With vegetation withering, even smaller creatures can be easier to spot. However, with safari holidays becoming more popular, this emphasis on each region's dry season means that travellers couldn't always escape from the crowds and even the most luxurious lodges often operate at capacity.

The Green Season – that is, the time when the bush comes alive during and after the rains – was often overlooked or dismissed as “not the right time” to go to Africa on holiday. Those in the know, however, referred to it as the Secret Season and like all the best secrets, it was worth keeping.

Let's quickly get the disadvantages of green season travel out of the way. Yes, you're more likely to get rained on (although it will probably be a short cloudburst rather than a sustained downpour, and given that it's summer, we're talking pleasantly warm rain). Yes, the wildlife will have dispersed somewhat and with plants growing at a furious pace, they'll have more places to hide. And yes, there may be more bugs than usual and the humidity will be higher.

With a little careful planning, and a spirit of adventure, we believe that the Green Season can be one of the very best times to visit Africa on safari – and now Journey Beyond can reveal its secrets.

Movements of animals in Africa are largely tied to rainfall, with herds congregating where the freshest, greenest shoots are to be found, and the thunder of their hooves following the distant rumble of storms. As we say in Africa, water makes the herds go round.



# Zimbabwe Self Drive Tips

- 1. Roads on whole pretty good but very narrow and a person can't average normal speeds of say 100 km/h or 120 km/h. You will be lucky if you average 70 or 80km/h**
- 2. MOST IMPORTANTLY do not let your fuel get below a half tank. Find a fuel station & fill up.**
- 3. Leave early and arrive early and relax**
- 4. Do not drive after dark**
- 5. There is not a lot of help out there should you need it or breakdown**

# Zimbabwe Self Drive Tips

6. There are not many road blocks. My old colleague Brent of Batonka was only stopped once for a driver's license in 5000kms in a 4 week drive through Zimbabwe and no hassles once stopped. Roadblocks were all manned by police & they were all polite & courteous.

7. If in a foreign vehicle you will get asked for TIP = Temporary Import Permit. You need to check it does not expire until well after the time your trip ends. Bushlore & others are based in Kasane. You get TIP at border up to 3 months. If you're given a car with a TIP check it does not expire during your trip. If so the vehicle will be impounded.

About 2 years ago Maui & Britz sent out vehicles with expired TIP's which is why their cars get impounded.

**9. General route comments**

- **Harare / BUQ or VV = full of people in road near HRE and no clear signage which is a bit frightening**
- **And Masvingo / Beatrice into HRE is not nice**
- **When self driving in Harare you need to have your wits about you**
- **Our colleagues drive VFA / BUQ at least twice a month (kids at school & sporting events). No drama**
- **VFA / HWN being done multiple times daily by numbers of operators & self drivers and no problems.**
